With this being his first year in seniors Rhyce is really starting to show he belongs there and will continue to improve as his confidence grows. With plenty of talent and skill on the bike after years of riding and winning titles in observed trials, he is only going to continue on his steep learning curve. With having not only the huge support from his dad and Argo Weld where he works, he has spent time with Shane Diener and aims to be the one who'll beat Diener at the prized 24 Hour Trial next weekend.

Diener saying "Rhyce is well on his way as I've been telling him for a while now, he just has to believe in himself and I have no doubt he will succeed. As for winning the 24 Hour, I'd loved for him to do that and he will, but hopefully only once I've retired".

With the 24 Hour Trial next weekend Rhyce will be aiming to finish in the top 3. After years of watching it's the first time he will be competing himself and he really looks to have the goods to get the result he's chasing.

We believe it's possible as he's in great form, and riding the high from the National rounds. He will definitely be a threat.
